Summary of Outputs for 2021

ICT Systems Management and Support.

ICT systems management and support work continues for all offices and health facilities. Development of the software and cloud hosting of the application server is provided by Amazon Web Services (AWS) and managed by our primary ICT Contractor Kuakawa Solutions.

SSM have installed the Solarwinds Remote Monitoring & Management (RMM) suite of software. SolarWinds RMM provides SSM's IT Support a comprehensive set of tools to efficiently secure, maintain, and improve its IT systems, all from a central dashboard that highlights and alerts any issues. RMM software includes: remote access, patch management, managed antivirus, web filtering and backup & recovery tools.



Payroll System

Online payroll SmoothPay. Time minder is to be re-introduced for all teams. Invoice Manager hasn't been incorporated into Xero, therefore additional hosting fees incurred for the second server.

Susu Mamas Intranet

This new platform as allowed us to merge our learning, communications and reporting on to one platform. COVID 19 added to our intranet along with additional training resources

Monitoring

Susu Mamas PNG Health Facilities and services all contribute NHIS data directly to the Provincial Health Information office. This is done via paper copies or e-NHIS (electronic device).

New applications for Monitoring and Reporting.

mSupply application is available for our health facility in Tari. Morobe mSupply not operating at present.

Susu Mamas further development of our eCIS has been on delayed due to insufficient funding. We have however been able to review what health care interventions women received at their 1st ANC visit and their 1st postnatal care check. Refer to postnatal care page 12.

Biometrics: SSM have been working with Kuakawa to introduce biometrics for all 1st ANC visits. This will improve our ability to provide follow up care for pregnant women and also to follow up mothers/newborns in the 1st week postnatal. This development has been deferred until further funding available.

Medication and Medical supplies.

All teams reported medication shortages of commonly used medication including; antibiotics, some family planning commodities.

Susu Mamas PNG Toll Free Line.

The number of calls to our Toll Free Health Information Line as decreased. To improve our response we need to increase our human resources dedicated to this information line and replace our current phone.

The number of mobile outreach services decreased by 32% (2020: 610). There was a 29% decrease in the total number of CU5 (2020: 82,054) attending urban and rural services, which subsequently resulted in a reduction in the number of children receiving routine immunisations.

The support from the Accelerating Immunisation and Health Systems Strengthening Program AIHSS; Central and Morobe provinces mitigated some of the impact of reduced funding for routine immunisations.

Hagen District eNHIS data: 2021 3rd Dose Pentalvant and M/R 9-17 mths – SSM contributed 42% and 39% of doses for the Hagen District². Lae District eNHIS data: 2021 3rd Dose Pentalvant and M/R 9-17 mths – SSM Lae health facilities (2) contributed 42% and 32% of doses for the Lae District². In addition we provided support to other Lae District health facilities to increase routine immunisation coverage for the District.

4.4 Objectives: Reduce malnutrition in children less than five (5) years of age.

There was a 32% decrease in the number of new cases of Malnutrition diagnosed 2021. Of these 13% required referral to Hospital. The decrease was due to the impact of reduced funding for health care workers. Counselling for families about nutrition for the malnourished child is crucial.




7.3 Increase individuals' and communities' involvement in their own health Rural Health






